2014 TCI Delegates' Meeting

This is a summary of this year's delegate meeting at the TCI Convention in Washington DC.

The meeting went fairly well. There were no major controversial issues to report.

There are 1,126 dues paying members of TCI clubs, with 43 clubs in good standing and 32 members at large. There are two (2) clubs in the process of startup and inquires about starting clubs in another nine (9) areas. Convention was attended by more than 15% of TCI members.

Tall Clubs International Foundation, the independent arm of TCI that funds the scholarship program, did very well financially as they were able to fund fourteen \$1,000.00 scholarships this year. Overall, the Foundation has awarded \$68,500.00 in scholarships over the years.

In the by-law department, most changes were to clarify and update the by-laws and could be considered housekeeping. TCI continues to struggle with how they get reports and information from clubs. Most clubs do not have a printed newsletter and that is what is needed, according to the by-laws, to report to TCI.

- A resolution was debated on cancelling a Queen's pageant if there are less than three (3) contestants. In this event, the executive board may appoint a Miss TI for the following year.
- Another resolution makes it OK for a member at large or member from a non-sponsoring club to run for queen.
- Finally, an approved resolution permits the use of certain TCI members as judges of the pageant.

There were other minor by-law and resolutions changes and I can discuss any of them with you if you are interested.
