And I'm going to repeat my observation about volunteering.

Non-profit organizations such as STC run on volunteers. Without volunteers, the organization fails. According to the August 2016 rooster there are 71 members in this club. However, the same few people keep having to take on offices because no one else volunteers. I've been through this before with a different not-for-profit. The last time I saw this situation, the group ended up disbanding because those few who had been able and willing to continue holding the offices required for the group to stay official were so burned out that they just were not willing to continue. A call was issued to solicit replacements: no one else offered to step up and take an active role. So the group was disbanded. Their funds were absorbed by the parent group. And any signs, banners, or other items owned by the group were taken into safekeeping by the members of the group.

If you do not want the Sacramento Tall Club to disappear, you, as a member, need to start taking an interest in what goes on behind the scenes and if possible, volunteer to take on an office.

STC Bylaws require that the club have the following officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Social Coordinator, Membership Coordinator, Publicity Coordinator, Marketing Coordinator, Editor, and Sergeant-At-Arms.

If you want to learn more about these offices, please contact the current office holders. Or come to a meeting. Or both!

From the President

[The following is a re-print of a letter that was sent to the STC membership. It has not been edited in any way, shape, or form. It has only been formatted to fit in this newsletter. - ed.]

Tall Greetings to all Sacramento Tall Club members,

It is important that I come to the Sacramento Tall Club membership with a report on an issue that many of you may not have been made aware.

It was my decision as President of Sacramento Tall Club not to make any formal public announcements on this issue until now.

In 2014, Tall Clubs International (TCI) accepted our bid to host the 2015 TCI convention. We formed a separate corporation (STC Events) to run the convention.

Due to the hard work of STC Events, costs were kept down. As a result, general refunds were enjoyed by those who paid for the full convention package.

STC Events decided that those who did substantial work for the convention deserved additional reimbursement for their contributions. Thus, a number of individuals received higher refunds than you may have received as a fully paid package participant.

TCI, our parent organization has by-laws and rules that govern TCI conventions. These rules define how the convention is run, who pays for what and how profits, if any, are to be distributed.

The by-laws state that the host club can receive no more than \$5000.00 in profit from running a convention. However, certain areas of the TCI by-law text, are not properly defined in the eyes of STC Events. STC Events made interpretations of the by-laws and made decisions based upon those views.

Per TCI by-laws, the financial records of each convention are audited by the TCI Alternate Treasurer after the convention.

The Alternate Treasurer reviewed the 2015 convention books and reported to the TCI executive board that there were certain concerns about expenses that STC Events claimed.

The TCI executive board interpreted that the additional refunds to the workers of convention were inappropriate expenses. The TCI executive board believes that these refunds to committee workers should have been taken from the profit that went to STC, and not out of the convention operational expenses.

The issue was ultimately brought before the TCI delegates meeting at the 2016 TCI convention. A motion was presented and passed, that Sacramento Tall Club would need to make further refunds to convention attendees. These refunds will come from the \$5000 STC convention profit.

There was extensive discussion at the September and October business meetings. There were strong opinions for both sides of the issue.

Ultimately, the STC board made the decision to comply with the TCI delegate's resolution to provide further refunds. STC will evenly divide the \$5000 profit that we received from STC Events to provide further refunds to the 2015 full package convention attendees.

I assure you that STC will still in a sound financial condition.

I have edited this narrative down substantially from all the details that were raised and brought to light. All discussions that were held at the business meetings concerning this issue are recorded in the meeting minutes.

The minutes are posted in the Member's Only section of our web site at http://www.sacramentotallclub.org./ The October minutes will be posted after approval at the November business meeting.

STC will attempt to impress upon TCI that a revision of their by-laws is needed to clarify the text that led to this situation.
