From the President

In the Footsteps of Cajanus

A special event for tall people took place on Tuesday, January 24th, 2017. The special city opera 'In the Footsteps of Cajanus' in Haarlem, Nehterlands. The event was in the hands of Vocal Studio Haarlem, Klub Lange Mensen (KLM Netherlands) and Lange Mensen Netherlands (Tall People Netherlands).

At 12:00 the doors of the venue, The Light Factory, opened. A nice location in a former gas and light factory, which formerly provided Haarlem with gas and electricity. The event was a tremendous success with 300 mostly-tall visitors. In the Oil House of the Light Factory was a varied exhibition with menswear, womenswear, big size shoes, office chairs, bicycles and solutions for better seating position in the plane. There were also various associations present with informative booths.

What is the "Cajanus - a giant opera" about?

The event in Haarlem was the kickoff of a series of activities around the opera about the Finnish giant Cajanus. Cajanus was born in Paltamo, Oulu, Finland, the son of a clergyman. Finland was at that time part of Sweden, and Cajanus was often referred to as the "Swedish Giant". Estimates of his adult height vary and range as high as 8 feet 1.4 inches (2.474 meters). Jan Bondeson, a medical professional and author who has researched and written on Cajanus, suggests that his true height was around 7 feet 8 inches (2.34 m). Bondeson's estimate is supported by contemporaneous accounts in the London Annual Register. Various unconfirmed versions of his early life exist, but tax records indicate he may have left the country in 1723 or soon afterward, and Finnish and Swedish tradition recounts that he joined the bodyguard of Frederick William I of Prussia, which was composed of unusually tall soldiers and was nicknamed the Potsdam Giants.





Cajanus lived for some years at the court of August II of Poland, where he served as a cavalry soldier. Following the king's death in 1733 he appears to have moved on, and according to Theophilus Cibber spent time in Germany before arriving in London, where he is recorded as having appeared at Drury Lane in February 1734, playing the part of Gargantua in the pantomime *Cupid and Psyche*, and in several other productions. He exhibited himself for money in various places in London, billed as the "Swedish Giant". His portrait was painted twice during his stay in England by the artist Enoch Seeman; one of these portraits is now in the National Museum of Finland and depicts him in his Polish soldier's uniform, with an inscription stating his height as 7 feet 10 inches (2.39 m). In 1735 he traveled to Paris, where he exhibited himself to paying audiences and was received privately at Versailles by Louis XV, the queen, and the dauphin. He later took up residence in Amsterdam, where he lived from 1735 to 1741 as the guest of the landlord of the Blauw Jan, an inn where natural curiosities could be seen and traded. After an unsuccessful spell as a money lender Cajanus returned to exhibiting himself, visiting England again in 1741 and 1742 and appearing before a meeting of the Royal Society, where his height was marked against a pillar and reported to be 7 feet 4.25 inches (224.2 cm) in his shoes. The society's president Martin Folkes observed that Cajanus appeared weak at this meeting, and could not stand for long.





Cajanus was quite popular in the Netherlands. In 1745 Cajanus settled in Haarlem, Netherlands, where he bought the right to live in the Proveniershuis, a sheltered housing unit that provided him with accommodation, meals and medical care. In the following years he wrote and published poetry and became a well-known figure in the town; a line marked on a pillar in the city's Grote Kerk still records his measured height during his residence there.

This same pillar now has a print illustrating his exhibitions together with Simon Paap, a dwarf who died in December 1828. A life-size painting of him also hung in the church for centuries, but today hangs in the Haarlem city hall. Cajanus died on 27 February 1749, leaving a large sum in his will to pay for a lavish funeral and a burial vault inside the Grote Kerk, with the intention of safeguarding his remains from disturbance. His coffin is said to have been 9 feet 7 inches (2.92 m) long. Despite his precautions, the vault was later sold, and Cajanus's bones were acquired by museums. Some are still held at the Museum of Anatomy in the University of Leiden. Today the Dutch language still remembers him with the slang term "Cajanus voeten", for unusually large feet. In period writings, the term "Cajaan" was used to mean a giant. The visitors of the event could get acquainted with unique Cajanus beer and the presentation of this event was done by Olivier Adjusters (2.18 m) and Wouter Corvers (2.03 m)

Visitors to the January event were able to compete for the title of "Tallest man / woman from Haarlem" or "Tallest man / woman of North Holland". The winners would receive a nice prize besides a certificate. The tallest person during this event, however, was measured a record length of 246 centimeters! Tallest man in the world!

Ingeborg B. was born in Laren, Noord-Holland, Netherlands. She currently lives in Almere-Stad, Flevoland, Netherlands. "Borg" petitioned for, and was granted, membership in the Sacramento Tall Club in 2016, and can be seen seated with Alice Q. in the front in our club photo from Convention 2016.

Patty H. is looking for a show of interest for those that are traveling to Pre-Con 2017 that may want to extend their stay on the west coast by 5 days, and participate in a Pre, Pre-Con Road Trip. We will start our journey in Santa Rosa on Monday, June 24, 2017. Tuesday, we would then travel up the Northern California's and Southern Oregon's coastline, arriving in Lincoln City on the 29th.
